Dear Friends.

During this Advent season, we join with other Christians around the world in celebrating the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ with a celebration called *A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols*. The festival was developed in 1880 at Truro Cathedral, in the city of Truro, Cornwell, England. Since 1918, this service has been held at sunset on Christmas Eve in King's College Chapel, Cambridge, England. Since its first radio broadcast in 1928, and its first television broadcast in 1958, the *Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols* has gained worldwide popularity.

Many variations and adaptations of the service can be found throughout the world, but here at Christ Church, we are following the traditional form of the service regularly used in King's College Chapel; a format we have followed for more than 30 years. The Bidding Prayer, written by the service's creator, Rev. Eric Milner-White (1884-1963), calls us together around the world, "... to hear again the message of the angels." The prayer can be adapted to include current prayer concerns, both local and global. The strength of the service lies in the scripture readings, which tell the story of our salvation beginning with Creation and the fall of mankind. The story then shifts to the prophecy of the coming Savior and the joys he will bring, his birth, adoration by the shepherds and the visit from the Wise Men. Since these scripture lessons tell a story, the service begins with, "Once upon a time..." as we sing the traditional opening carol, "Once In Royal David's City." Music is carefully chosen to bring a new and current light to the ancient scriptures as they are read. In the past, we have used the King James Version (KJV) of the Bible for all the scripture readings mainly because of its poetic language. As an experiment, tonight we will be using the New King James Version, which maintains the original poetic nature but is more in line with the Biblical language used today. Each lesson will conclude with the traditional phrase, "This is the Word of the Lord." The people's response is, "Thanks be to God."

Because the *Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols* is a worship service, it is designed to unfold in a given manner. Therefore, we gratefully request that there be...

NO APPLAUSE AND NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY AT ANY TIME.

Again, this is a worship service, not a performance, and flash photography and applause would disrupt the flow of the unfolding Biblical story.

Also, please turn OFF alarms and ringers on all cell phones, pagers, watches, etc.

These items are particularly disruptive during any worship service.

Tonight's festival is also being livestreamed through the Christ Church Facebook page.

Music is a beautiful and glorious gift from God, and all of us in some shape or form, can utilize this gift. You are encouraged to participate in the congregational singing with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength because, "If you believe what you are singing, then sing it like you believe it." The words to all the congregational hymns are printed in **bold italic type**. If you prefer, please sing parts on these hymns, which can also be found in the United Methodist Hymnal or in the other supplement materials between the seats

This year, I decided to add a creed after the 9th lesson. The "Christmas Creed" was written by Rev. William Russell Bowie (1882-1969), an Episcopalian priest who spent much of his ministry working with social justice issues. I first saw this creed published on the front of a Christ Church worship bulletin that is stored in the church archives dated December 29, 1957. With all the political, social and religious division in the United States today, I thought this creed needed to be added to tonight's festival as we all strive to work toward unity in Jesus Christ.
